S T A T E O F M A I N E

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Relative to Protection of Fur-bearing Animals Owned by
Breeders.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 76, amended. Section 76 of chapter 38, of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby repealed and the following inserted in place thereof:

‘Sec. 76. Persons shall not enter enclosure of, kill or injure fur-bearing animals owned or bred by another. Any person owning or breeding fur-bearing animals under the provisions of sections 9 and 9-B of this chapter, shall have the same property rights therein as enjoyed by owners or breeders of domestic animals.

No person shall enter the enclosure wherein said fur-bearing animals are kept or shall knowingly and wilfully, kill, trap or injure any fur-bearing animal without the consent of the owner thereof.’
