## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Regulation of Sporting Camps by the Commissioner.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 17, amended. Section 17 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

Sporting camps, regulation of by commissioner; penalty. 'Sec. 17. person shall maintain, occupy, or keep a sporting camp, lodge, or place of resort for inland hunting or fishing parties, without annually procuring a license therefor, paying \$20, but such license shall not be granted within the limits of any of the unorganized townships embraced in the Maine Forestry District, unless the applicant files with his application the written consent of the owners of the land upon which such sporting camp, lodge, or place of resort is or may be located; and on the 15th day of December of each year shall send such record to the commissioner, together with a report of the number of residents and non-residents entertained in such sporting camp, lodge, or place of resort, and such other useful information relative to the inland fish and game interests as the commissioner may deem of importance to the state. The commissioner may refuse to issue a license or licenses to such person or persons as he deems unsuitable. violates any provision of this section shall pay a fine of \$50 and costs for each offense.'
