**AN ACT Regulating the Closed Time on Scallops.**

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**P. L., 1933, c. 2, § 71, amended.** The first sentence of section 71 of chapter 2 of the public laws of 1933 is hereby amended to read as follows:

‘No person shall catch, buy, or sell, expose for sale, give away, or have in his possession for any purpose, any scallops, shelled or in the shell, between the 15th day of April and the 1st day of ~~November~~ **December** of each year,; or in the waters of Bagaduce river to a point at the mouth of said river marked by a line and bound, extending from Dice’s Head in Castine through the southern-most point of Nautilus Island to the Brooksville shore, between the 15th day of April and the 1st day of January next following of each year.’
