## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT to Permit Sunday Moving Pictures.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 135, additional. Chapter 135 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto 2 new sections, to be numbered 39-G and 39-H, and to read as follows:

'Sec. 39-G. Sunday moving pictures, legalized. In any city or town that shall vote as hereinafter provided, it shall be lawful for any moving picture theater to have an exhibition of moving pictures on Sunday between the hours of 3 P. M. and 11:30 P. M.'

'Sec. 39-H. Local option. Section 39-G shall not be effective in any city until the municipal officers of a city so vote or in any town until an article in a town warrant so providing has been adopted at an annual town meeting. When a city or town has voted in favor of adopting the provisions of section 39-G, said provisions shall be effective until repealed in the same manner as above provided.'
