STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Relative to Closing Areas Stocked with Rabbits.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 4-A, additional. Chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 4-A and to read as follows:

'Sec. 4-A. Areas stocked with rabbits may be closed. The commissioner may by issuing rules and regulations close to all hunting, for not more than one hunting season, such areas as he may deem advisable in localities where rabbits are being stocked at the expense of the state or any fish and game association, said rules and regulations to be published once in a newspaper having a circulation in the locality where the rabbits are being liberated.'
