AN ACT Relative to Licenses for Dealers In Furs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S., c. 38, § 94, repealed. Section 94 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby repealed and the following inserted in place thereof.

'Sec. 94. Licenses for dealers in furs. The commissioner may annually issue licenses to engage in the business of buying skins of fur-bearing animals as follows: Residents of this state may purchase for an annual fee of \$25 a license to engage in the business of buying the skins of any fur-bearing animal; also residents of this state may purchase, for an annual fee of \$3 a county license to engage in the business of buying the skins of any fur-bearing animal. Out of state residents may, by paying a fee satisfactory to the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, engage in the business of buying the skins of any fur-bearing animal. For further information and for application blanks for such licenses apply to the commissioner of inland fisheries and game at Augusta, Maine.'
