AN ACT Relative to Black Bear.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 72, amended. Paragraph (c) of section 72 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby repealed and the following inserted in place thereof:

‘(c). The black bear is hereby classified as a game animal with open and closed seasons thereon in the various counties corresponding to the open season on deer, and no person shall take, catch, kill or have in possession any bear during the closed season thereon, except that it shall be lawful for any farmer or owner or live stock to kill bear at any time while they are on his own property.’
