#### AN ACT Defining Jack-light.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 40, amended. Paragraph (c) of section 40 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Jack-light when hunting means any artificial light when used in conjunction with a rifle larger than 22 ealiber, and a 22 hipower is considered larger, or a shotgum any firearm other than a 22 caliber pistol.'
