STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Children's Hospital, at Portland, for Treatment of Pearl Cormier, of Mexico.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to the Children's Hospital, at Portland, the sum of \$1,479 for treatment of Pearl Cormier, of Mexico.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Pearl Cormier, of Mexico, was admitted to the Children's Hospital, at Portland, on May 21, 1937 and is still under treatment at that hospital. The town of Mexico paid for her treatment for a time but has declined to make further payments on the ground that her father, Paul Cormier, should be able to take care of the expense. The hospital appears to be left in a situation where it cannot collect from the town or from the father, and as the bill is large and will continue for an indefinite time, and in view of the financial condition of the town of Mexico, the state is asked to assume the responsibility for treatment of this child.
