IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-NINE.

RESOLVE, in Favor of June N. Wood, of Bangor, Maine.

June N. Wood; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$200 to be paid to June N. Wood of Bangor, Maine, as a settlement in full of all claims for injuries and damages to her lands situated in Frankfort, in Waldo county, Maine, and known as the Treat Point Farm, by entry thereon under the direction of the state highway commission and cutting down and pulling up trees, excavating sand and gravel, digging large holes and leaving them open, leaving slash thereon, and building fires without the consent of the said June N. Wood; the said sum to be paid from the state highway commission appropriation for the fiscal years of 1939-1940.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

That June N. Wood, of Bangor, Maine, is the owner of the lands above described, and has been the owner for several years last past. That in the spring of 1938, acting under the direction of the said state highway commission, engineers, surveyors, their helpers and employees, made a survey for the proposed new road extending through Frankfort Village along Frankfort Marsh, so-called, and in making said survey entered upon and occupied a portion of the above described premises, cutting down and pulling up a large number of trees estimated at fifty trees more or less, excavated sand and gravel, and dug large holes being about ten more or less in number and left the said holes without protection and without filling in the same, and left slash and debris and other rubbish upon the said land, and built fires thereon, all being without the consent or permission of the said June N. Wood or any person in authority; that by reason of the acts and conduct of said persons, acting under the direction of the State Highway Commission as aforesaid in making said survey, her lands were damaged and injured in the sum of \$200.
