## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Admissibility in Evidence of Declarations of Deceased and Insane Persons.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Evidence of declarations. In any civil action or proceeding at law or in equity, if a statement, whether written or oral, of a person deceased or insane, is offered in evidence, such statement shall not be excluded as hear-say, provided that the trial judge or tribunal shall find, (1) that the statement was made at the time when the person making the same was mentally competent to understand the meaning and effect of such statement; (2) that it was made before the commencement of the action or proceeding in which such statement is so offered in evidence; (3) that it was made in good faith and upon the personal knowledge of the person making the same.
