**AN ACT Exempting the Transportation of Neat Cattle from the Common
Carrier Law.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1935, c. 146, § 10, amended. That part numbered (3) of paragraph (A), of section 10 of chapter 146 of the public laws of 1935, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

‘(3) while engaged exclusively in the delivery of the United States mail; while engaged exclusively in the transportation of fresh fruits and vegetables from farms to canneries, place of storage or place of shipment during the harvesting, canning or packing season; (4) while engaged exclusively in the hauling of wood, pulpwood, logs or sawed lumber from the wood lot or forest area where cut or sawed to points within 40 miles thereof, or while hauling, within said distance, horses, crew, equipment and supplies to or from such wood lot or forest area; (5) **while engaged exclusively in the transportation of neat cattle for exhibition purposes only, to and from agricultural exhibits and fairs receiving a part or the whole of the premiums awarded from the state department of agriculture.** Nothing in this act contained shall apply to persons, firms or corporations operating motor vehicles carrying property of which they are the actual and bona fide owners.’
