AN ACT Relating to Outdoor Advertising.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1933, c. 268, § 19, amended. Section 19 of chapter 268 of the public laws of 1933, as amended by section 1 of chapter 236 of the public laws of 1937, is hereby further amended so that the 1st paragraph of said chapter 236 shall read as follows:

‘No manufacturer or foreign wholesaler of malt liquors shall hold for sale, sell, offer for sale, in intrastate commerce, malt liquors or transport or cause the same to be transported into the state of Maine for resale unless such manufacturer or foreign wholesaler has obtained from the state liquor commission a certificate of approval. The fee for a certificate of approval issued shall be \$100 per annum, which sum shall accompany the application for such certificate, **together with an agreement to be prepared by the state liquor commission in which the manufacturer or foreign wholesaler of malt liquor agrees not to advertise any malt liquors on bill boards in Maine and said agreement shall provide that the commission may revoke the certificate of approval if the agreement is violated.**’
