STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Regulating the Sale of Malt.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Licenses for the sale of malt and malt syrup. Malt or malt syrup shall not be sold except for bakery and industrial purposes by any person, firm or corporation unless duly licensed by the state liquor commission.

Licenses for the sale of malt and malt syrup under such regulations as the state liquor commission may prescribe, may be issued by the state liquor commission upon an application in such form as may be prescribed by said commission and upon payment of a fee of \$100 per annum.

Any person selling except for bakery and industrial purposes, without a license, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500 or by imprisonment for less than I year.
