STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Part-time Malt Liquor Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1937, c. 237, § 17, amended. Section 17 of chapter 237 of the public laws of 1937 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 17. Part-time malt liquor license for hotels, clubs and restaurants. The liquor commission may also grant to any person upon written application in such form as the commission may from time to time prescribe a 6 months' license which will permit the person to whom the license is granted to sell malt liquors for consumption on said licensed premises during the months of May, June, July, August, September and October. The person licensed shall not sell malt liquors or conduct any other business on said licensed premises during the months of November, December, January, February, March and April. The fee for said license shall be \$50. \$125 for each hotel and restaurant, and \$50 for each club.'
