STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Granting Part-time Malt Liquor Licenses to Hotels.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1937, c. 237, § 17, amended. Section 17 of chapter 237 of the public laws of 1937 is hereby amended by adding a new section at the end thereof to be numbered section 17-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 17-A. Special licenses for summer hotels. Without the approval of the municipal officers of the town, the liquor commissioner may grant to any person, who is in good faith operating a summer hotel "so-called" upon written application in such form as the commissioner may from time to time prescribe, a license which will permit the said applicant to sell malt liquors for consumption on said licensed premises during the months of June, July, August and September for which the applicant shall file a bond as required in section 4 of said chapter and pay a fee of \$40 for such license.'
