STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to Toy Pistols.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 140, § 17, amended. Section 17 of chapter 140 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 17. Toy pistols, sale of, prohibited. Whoever has in his possession a toy pistol for the explosion of percussion eaps or blank cartridges, with intention to sell it, or sells or offers to sell or give it away, shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$5, nor more than \$100, and shall be liable for all damages resulting from such selling, or giving away, to be recovered in an action on the case.'
