STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

RESOLVE, Relative to the Digging of Clams in the Towns of Wiscasset and Edgecomb.

Regulation of digging of clams in Wiscasset and Edgecomb. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be and hereby is authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation as follows:

No clams or worms shall be taken within the limits of the towns of Wiscasset and Edgecomb in Lincoln county by any person, firm or corporation not a resident of one of said towns. This shall not interfere with any law relating to the digging of shellfish for bait by fishermen. Whoever violated any of the provisions hereof shall, for each offense, be punished by a fine of not more than \$10 or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days.
