**AN ACT** Assenting to the Provisions of the Act of Congress Entitled "An Act to Provide that the United States Shall Aid the States in Wildlife-restoration Projects, and for Other Purposes".

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

**R. S., c. 38, additional.** Chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section, to be numbered 110 and to read as follows :

'Sec. 110. Assenting to the provisions of the act of Congress entitled "An act to provide that the United States shall aid the states in wildlife-restoration projects, and for other purposes". The state of Maine hereby assents to the provisions of the act of congress entitled "An act to provide that the United States shall aid the states in wildlife-restoration projects, and for other purposes," approved September 2, 1937 (Public no. 415, 75th congress), and the department of inland fisheries and game is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to perform such acts as may be necessary to the conduct and establishment of cooperative wildlife-restoration projects, as defined in said act of congress, in compliance with said act and with rules and regulations promulgated by the secretary of agriculture thereunder; and no fund accruing to the state of Maine from license fees paid by hunters shall be diverted for any other purpose than the administration of the department of inland fisheries and game.'
