RESOLVE, Creating a Recess Committee on Motor Vehicle Legislation.

Recess committee on motor vehicle legislation, created. Resolved: That there be and hereby is created a legislative recess committee to consist of 1 member of the senate and 2 members of the house of representatives to be appointed by the governor with the approval of the council, which committee shall be known as the Committee on Motor Vehicle Legislation. Said committee shall meet as soon as convenient after appointment and organize by electing a chairman and secretary. Said committee shall consider and investigate the present laws of the state regulating the registration, insurance and operation of motor vehicles and the licensing of operators thereof, and the need of further additional enactments with especial reference to the safe operation of such motor vehicles and the protection of the public. Said committee shall report its findings and recommendations to the 90th legislature and, in the event that it finds it desirable that further legislation be enacted, or that present legislation should be codified, it shall draft a bill, or bills, for that purpose and have the same presented to the 90th legislature. The members of said committee shall receive their actual expenses incurred in the discharge of this duty, said expenses to be approved by the governor and council.
