**AN ACT** Relating to the Use of White Lines on the Highway to Regulate  
Traffic.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 29, § 70, amended.** Section 70 of chapter 29 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following:

‘Wherever the state highway commission has caused a white line to be painted upon any highway, the drivers of motor vehicles approaching each other shall give an audible warning with the horn or other warning device of the vehicle at a distance of 200 feet from the other vehicle and, until they have passed, each shall keep to his right hand of such white line: the driver of an overtaken motor vehicle on such highway shall keep to his right hand of such white line until passed, provided the driver of the overtaking vehicle gives an audible warning with his horn or other warning device of his approach when within 200 feet of the front vehicle.’
