S T A T E O F M A I N E

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-NINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of George H. Larrabee, of Portland.

George H. Larrabee; pension for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid out of the appropriation for teachers' pensions, to George H. Larrabee of Portland, the sum of \$275 per year, during the lifetime of the said Larrabee, said sum to be paid in quarterly installments.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

George H. Larrabee is 72 years of age. A graduate of Bowdoin College and has taught 27 years in the state of Maine, as follows:

Principal Buxton high school 1888-1891	3 yrs.
Principal Pennell Institute 1891-1893	2 yrs.
Principal Bridgton Academy 1893-1895	2 yrs.
Principal Lincoln Academy 1895-1908	13 yrs.
Principal Bangor high school 1908-1915	7 yrs.

A considerable portion of the above mentioned service was in institutions which fall within the definition and provisions of the teachers' pension law. Claim is based upon the fact that service was entirely within the state and rendered to citizens of Maine, even though not all institutions served can classify as public schools.
