IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-NINE

RESOLVE, Relating to the Digging of Clams in the Town of Brooksville.

Digging of clams in town of Brooksville, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation prohibiting any person, not an inhabitant of said town of Brooksville, from digging clams for commercial purposes within said town. Whoever violates any provision of this rule and regulation shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$25 or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days.
