S T A T E O F M A I N E

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-NINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of O. M. Froding, of Portland.

O. M. Froding; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, in favor of O. M. Froding, of Portland, the sum of \$25 as a full and final settlement against the state, for damage to his car by Charles Bishop, an inmate of the State School for Boys in South Portland; said sum to be paid from the general funds of the state.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

In the forenoon of October 20, 1937, Charles Bishop of the State School for Boys in South Portland, stole from a parking lot in Westbrook, a Chevrolet automobile belonging to Mr. Froding. The boy was apprehended the following day and in his testimony to Sheriff Burnell, he admitted having stolen the car.
