AN ACT Relating to Children.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 129, § 34, amended. Section 34 of chapter 129 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 34. Admitting to or allowing children in disorderly house; penalty, etc. Whoever admits or allows to remain in any disorderly house, house of ill fame, gambling place, or place where intoxicating liquors are sold **illegally**; or other place injurious to health or morals, owned, kept, maintained, managed or controlled by him in whole or in part, any child under the age of 16 years, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100, or by imprisonment for not more than 60 days.'
