STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to the Duties of the State Police.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. Inspections relating to malt liquor in certain towns and cities, how conducted. All inspections with reference to malt liquor in cities and towns of less than 10,000 population, shall hereafter be conducted and performed by the state police subject to the direction of the chief of the state police and in accordance with such rules and regulations as the state liquor commission may prescribe.
- Sec. 2. Report. Said state police shall report such inspections to the state liquor commission in such manner as said commission may prescribe.
- Sec. 3. Liquor commission to conduct inspections in certain cases. Whenever it is determined by the governor and council that, in any given locality, such inspections cannot feasibly be conducted by said state police, the liquor commission shall be authorized to conduct the same by its own employees.
