STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE.

RESOLVE, Providing for the Payment of Certain Damages Caused by Protected Wild Animals.

Damages caused by deer, moose and bears to automobiles and crops; provided for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$1,301.91 to be paid to certain persons, the amount in the aggregate as set against the following names as a full and final settlement against the state for damages to their cars, camps and crops by deer, moose and bears; said sum to be paid from the inland fisheries and game funds.
