AN ACT Relating to the Maine Forestry District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S. c. 11, § 75, amended. Section 75 of chapter 11 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 75. Prevention, control and extinguishment of fires; look-out stations; forest fire trails. The forest commissioner shall take measures for the prevention, control and extinguishment of forest fires in said forestry district and to this end he shall establish such sub-forestry districts as he may deem necessary for effective protection against loss or damage by fire. He may establish look-out stations connected by telephone and equip and maintain depots for necessary tools for the extinguishment of forest fires, and may construct and maintain trails and roads, and may assume the maintenance, operation and utilization of forest truck-trails built for the purpose of preventing and suppressing forest fires, constructed by the Civilian Conservation Corps or other agency of the United States Government.'
