STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

AN ACT Relating to the Registration and Operation of Motor Vehicles by Nonresidents.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Nonresident registration. A motor vehicle owned by a resident of any state adjoining the state of Maine and used to carry property for profit or hire, which has been duly registered for the current year in said adjoining state, of which the owner is a resident, and in accordance with the laws thereof to carry a load of not exceeding 3 tons, may be operated upon the highways of this state, without registration under the laws of this state, for the same period allowed by such adjoining state to residents of this state; provided, however, that this exemption shall not be operative as to a motor vehicle used for the transportation of persons or property for hire or profit between points within this state.
