S T A T E O F M A I N E

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
THIRTY-NINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Joseph Michaud, of Berwick.

Joseph Michaud; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is appropriated, the sum of \$82.10 as a full and final settlement against the state, to compensate him for hospital and doctors' bills incurred by him in the treatment of his minor son, Henry Michaud, who was wilfully injured by one, Leo Rouselle, a state charge; said sum to be paid from the general funds of the state.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

On August 12, 1937, one, Leo Rouselle, a boy about 10 years of age, who was at that time a charge of the state, took an iron bar and struck Henry Michaud, a four-year old son of Joseph Michaud across the nose and breaking the cartelage, causing a very bad injury.
