STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-NINE

RESOLVE, Authorizing the Appointment of a Committee to Study the Advisability of a Contributory Retirement System for Maine.

RESOLVED, that a committee be appointed consisting of 2 Senators to be appointed by the president of the senate, 2 representatives to be appointed by the speaker of the house, and 1 citizen of Maine to be appointed by the governor, and who shall be chairman of the committee, to be charged with the duty of making a comprehensive study of the existing situation as it relates to compensation of officers and employees of the state, and its several departments, and of the political subdivisions thereof, including municipalities, so far as the same shall afford a basis for devising a suitable system of retirement compensation, contributory or otherwise.

That such committee be empowered to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of books and papers, and to employ such technical and professional assistance as they may deem necessary.

That the members of such committee shall receive no compensation for their services but shall be paid their actual and necessary traveling, hotel and other expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties.

That such committee make report of its findings and conclusions to the 90th legislature.

That the sum of \$2500 or so much thereof as may be needed, is hereby appropriated for carrying out the purposes of this resolve.
