STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY

AN ACT Relating to Unemployment Compensation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 26, chapter 192, public laws of the state of Maine for the year 1935, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding thereto the following, viz:

If at any time when the legislature of the state is not in regular session, the congress of the United States makes change in any federal law which causes any provision of chapter 192 of the public laws of Maine for the year 1935, as amended, to differ from said federal law as changed, then and in such circumstances said chapter 192 shall be held to be similarly changed, until the legislature of Maine shall have met in regular session and acted on proposed changes in the state of Maine law. To the end, among other things, that Maine employers may not be compelled to pay out money during a period between the federal change and the regular session of our legislature, which payment will not be required under the federal statutes then in effect.
