AN ACT Relating to Oak Grove School.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Oak Grove school incorporated. George Loring Crosman, William T. Hussey, Lindley M. Binford, Arthur Jones, Harry Harrison, their associates, successors, and assigns are hereby constituted a corporation by the name of Oak Grove school, and by this name may sue and be sued, have a common seal, make such by-laws as they may deem expedient for the management of their affairs, fill all vacancies occurring in their number, increase their number if they see fit to not exceeding 15 and may take and hold any estate, real or personal, that they may now possess or may hereafter receive by donation or otherwise; and the trustees aforesaid is hereby invested with all the powers and privileges incident to similar corporations.

Sec. 2. Purposes of act. The purpose of this act is to revive the corporation originally created by chapter 290 of the private and special laws, approved April 5, 1854. Said new corporation is authorized to acquire the plant, property and franchises and continue the work now being done by Oak Grove school in Vassalboro.

Sec. 3. First meeting. Any one of said corporators is authorized to call the first meeting by giving written notice to the other persons above named at least 7 days before the date fixed for such meeting.
