AN ACT Regulating the Dimming of Lights on Approaching Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 29, additional. Chapter 29 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 82-A, and to read as follows:

‘Sec. 82-A. Oncoming motor vehicle lights to be dimmed. All operators of motor vehicles shall dim the head lights of the motor vehicle they are operating, whenever another motor vehicle approaches their motor vehicle from the direction opposite to that in which they are going, when they are at a distance of approximately 300 feet from the approaching motor vehicle, and shall keep their lights dimmed until the aforesaid approaching vehicle has passed their motor vehicle.’
