AN ACT Relating to Sunday Moving Pictures.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 135, § 39-H, amended. Section 39-H of chapter 135 of the revised statutes, as created by chapter 255 of the public laws of 1939, is hereby amended to read as follows:

‘Sec. 39-H. Local option. Section 39-H shall not be effective in any city until a majority of the legal voters, present and voting, at any regular ~~or special~~ election so vote or in any town until an article in such town warrant so providing has been adopted at an annual ~~or special~~ town meeting; provided, however, the municipal officers of a city so voting, that section 39-G shall be effective in such city until a vote thereon has been taken at the next regular ~~or special~~ municipal election. When a city or town has voted in favor of adopting the provisions of section 39-G, said provisions shall be effective until repealed in the same manner as above provided. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation operating any theatrical or motion picture show on Sunday to require or permit any employee of said person, firm or corporation to work or be on duty more than 6 days in any 1 week.’
