STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-ONE

AN ACT Clarifying the Disposition of Dog Tax Funds.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 5, § 168, amended. Section 168 of chapter 5 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 168. Expenditure of money remaining in state treasury. All money received by the treasurer of state as provided in section 159 and remaining unexpended at the end of the fiscal year shall be credited to the several cities, towns, and plantations upon their state tax in proportion to the amount each has paid into the state treasury under the provisions of this chapter and so much thereof as remains unexpended as aforesaid is hereby appropriated to pay the same; provided, however, that the amount to be refunded to such plantations as are taxed as wild lands shall be paid direct to the plantation treasurer instead of being credited upon the state tax. The "Dog Licenses" fund shall not lapse, and any money belonging therein, received after the close of any fiscal year shall be added thereto to be disposed of as above at the close of the current fiscal year.'
