STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Time of Completion of Work on Third Class Roads.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 28, § 45, amended. Section 45 of chapter 28 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

Municipal officers may recommend roads for construction; standards regulated. Municipal officers of any town may file with the state highway commission the description or location of the road whose construction and improvement they recommend under the provisions of sections 44 to 47. After acceptance by the commission of a location as above, construction shall proceed and continue on that location until the entire length of the road has been constructed, or until the location is changed. completion of any road located as above, municipal officers shall file with the commission recommendation for location upon another road. In case the municipal officers are unable to agree upon the designation of a third class road, it shall then be the right of the commission to make such designation and to proceed with the construction of the road as provided in said sections. The work performed under said sections shall conform to standards adopted by the commission taking into consideration the width and type of construction suited to the conditions there existing. Work shall be completed before the thirtieth day of October annually.
