STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Guides for Non-residents.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 51, amended. Section 51 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 51. Kindling of fires by non-residents, regulated. Non-residents shall not kindle fires upon any unorganized township, while engaged in camping, fishing or hunting from May 1st to December 1st, without being in charge of a registered guide, except at public camp sites maintained by the forestry department. No guide shall at the same time guide or be employed by more than 2 non-residents in hunting.'
