STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Falsely Assuming to be a Justice or Officer.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 133, §25, amended. Section 25 of chapter 133 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 25. Penalty for falsely assuming to be an officer. Whoever falsely assumes to be a justice of the peace, sheriff, deputy sheriff, health inspector, or health officer, constable, inland fish and game warden, commissioner of inland fisheries and game, state humane agent, ~~or~~ state police **officer, commissioner of agriculture, or agent of the commissioner of agriculture** and who falsely acts as such or who requires anyone to aid him in a matter pertaining to the duties of any such office which he does not hold, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500, or by imprisonment for not more than 11 months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.'
