STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-ONE

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Swan Pond.

Fishing in Swan Pond, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation, closing Swan Pond, in Lyman in the county of York, to ice fishing for all fish except that it shall be open to ice fishing on Saturdays, Sundays and Mondays during the month of February only each year.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The York County Clubs would appreciate immediate legislative action on this particular bill which they consider an **emergency**. If possible this bill should become a law by February 1st 1941, which would prevent the slaughter of a large number of sizeable salmon weighing from 2 lbs. to $4\frac{1}{2}$ lbs. each. The law as it now reads covering this body of water permits the taking of game fish (**trout and salmon**) through the ice during the entire months of February and March.
