RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Barkers Pond.

Fishing in Barkers Pond, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Barkers Pond, in Lyman and Dayton, in the county of York, to ice fishing for pickerel, white perch, hornpout, yellow perch, eels, cusk, chubs and smelts from the time ice forms in the fall until it goes out in the spring, and for all fish (except bass) during February and March of each year.
