STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-ONE

AN ACT Forbidding Sale of Liquor to Certain Persons.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Sale of liquor to certain persons prohibited. It shall be unlawful for any agent of any state liquor store, his clerk, helper, servant or agent to sell any intoxicating liquor to any person after notice has been given by any member of the family of said applicant that liquor shall not be sold to said applicant. Whoever shall violate any of the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100, and by imprisonment for not more than 2 months; and in default of payment of fine, by imprisonment for not more than 3 months. A second offense shall be punished by a fine of \$200 and by imprisonment for 6 months.

Sec. 2. Penalty for aiding in unlawful sale. It shall be unlawful for any person to act as agent or to in any way purchase any intoxicating liquor for an applicant after the liquor store, or stores, have been requested not to sell to said applicant. Whoever shall violate any of the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of \$100 and costs and by imprisonment for 2 months, and in default of payment of the fine, by imprisonment for not more than 3 months. A second offense shall be punished by a fine of \$200, and by imprisonment for 6 months.
