STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to the Old Folks Home at Bath.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 2 of chapter 2, private and special laws of 1917 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 2. May hold property to amount of \$1,000,000. Under the above name, said corporation may sue and be sued, take by purchase, gift, devise, bequest or otherwise, real and personal property, and hold the same for the purpose expressed in section one to an amount not exceeding ~~four hundred thousand~~ **\$1,000,000** ~~dollars~~; and may control, manage, sell and dispose of the same for the purpose aforesaid; and shall possess all the rights, privileges and immunities, and be subject to all the duties and liabilities that pertain and belong to corporations created for charitable purposes under the laws of this state.'
