IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-ONE

AN ACT Approving the Purchase of Lamoine Coal Depot.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Certain acts of governor and council, approved. The acts of the governor and council under and by virtue of an order passed by the council, and by the governor approved, dated November 29, 1927, in the acquisition by purchase from the Department of the Navy of the federal government the site of the former United States Naval Coal Depot and the improvements thereon located on Frenchman's Bay, in Hancock county, and the filing for record of a duly executed deed of the same, dated December 20, 1927, which is recorded in Hancock county Registry of Deeds in book 619, page 470, hereby are ratified, confirmed and approved.

Sec. 2. Name of property. Said property shall be called the Lamoine State Wharf and Park, and shall be a part of the park system within the meaning of chapter 144 of the public laws of 1935.

Sec. 3. Free wharfage to certain organizations. The Sea Coast Mission and any other religious or charitable organizations shall have the right of free wharfage on said property.

Sec. 4. Designation of certain highway. The Douglas state highway

"N-1" No. 184 shall be designated as extending $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to the said wharf and shall be maintained by the state.

Sec. 5. Erection of signs. Proper signs shall be erected along the Douglas state highway to direct the public to said property and to distinguish the same.

Sec. 6. Saving clause. All acts, or parts of acts, or orders, inconsistent with the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed or amended to conform with the provisions hereof.
