#### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-ONE

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Jay.

Town of Jay, reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$3442.14, to reimburse the said town of Jay for pauper supplies furnished Edward C. Courteau, his wife and 5 minor children; he being a state pauper.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

The town of Jay began to furnish Edward C. Courteau, his wife and minor children with pauper supplies in 1927 and has continued to furnish them with supplies up to the present date with the exception of the years 1928, 1930 and 1937, the total amount expended being \$3442.14.

These supplies were furnished by the overseers of the poor of the town of Jay under the belief that Edward C. Courteau was a resident pauper of the town of Jay.

It has recently come to the knowledge of the overseers of the poor of the town of Jay, that the said Edward C. Courteau, his wife and minor children are state paupers. This fact was made known by the affidavit furnished by the said Edward C. Courteau relative to his pauper settlement, which affidavit shows that he has never gained a pauper residence in the town of Jay and has no pauper settlement in the state of Maine.
