RESOLVE, Opening South Bog Stream to Fly-fishing.

South Bog stream; opened to fly-fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening to fly-fishing only, South Bog stream from its entrance to Rangeley lake to the junction of the west branch and the outlet of Beaver pond, with a bag limit of 4 fish or not over 3 pounds, no trout under 8 inches; said stream being located in Rangeley and Rangeley plantation. Tributaries closed.
