RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Dead River in Orland.

Fishing in Dead river in Orland, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Dead river in Orland, county of Hancock, to ice fishing for pickerel, white perch, hornpout, yellow perch, eels, cusk, chubs and smelts from the time the ice forms in the fall until it goes out in the spring and for all fish (except bass) during February, March and April, to a point established by red posts on either bank, 1 mile above Alamoosook Pond.
