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**RESOLVE, Relating to the Taking and Sale of Clams in the Town of  
Cape Elizabeth.**

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**Taking and sale of clams in Cape Elizabeth, regulated. Resolved:**  
That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to repeal the first paragraph of rule and regulation numbered 55 as set forth in the official rules and regulations of the department, and chapter 36 of the resolves of 1937, and to issue the following in place thereof:

‘No person shall, in the town of Cape Elizabeth, in the county of Cumberland, dig or take clams for sale unless license has been granted to him by the municipal officers of said town, who are hereby authorized to grant and issue such license and fix the fee therefor. No license shall be granted or issued except to a resident of said town. Nothing herein shall prohibit any resident or a riparian owner of shores or flats therein from digging and taking clams for food for himself and family without license. The term “inhabitant” shall mean a person who has resided in this state for the term of at least 6 consecutive months and in the town of Cape Elizabeth for at least 3 consecutive months.’
