STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Non-resident Fishing Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 19, amended. The 1st paragraph and paragraph numbered (3) of section 19 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, are hereby amended to read as follows:

'No resident of the state over 18 years of age and no non-resident over the age of ± 0 15 years shall fish in any inland waters of the state except in accordance with the following provisions:

'(3) Non-resident fishing licenses shall be of 3 classes, a 15 day license to cost \$3.15, effective for 15 days from the date of purchase thereof, and a season license, effective for the entire season, to cost \$5.15, but the amount paid for a 15 day license shall be credited on the purchase of a year license upon an additional payment of \$2.15, also a junior non-resident license, which shall be a season license covering all non-residents between the ages of ± 0 15 and ± 6 18 years, to cost \$1.15. Fifteen cents shall be retained by the agent for each license issued.'
