STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to the Town of Princeton Lighting District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1939, c. 38, § 2, amended. Section 2 of chapter 38 of the private and special laws of 1939 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 2. Powers. Said district is further authorized and empowered to make any or all extensions of the distribution system for supplying electricity to the inhabitants of said town of Princeton, Plantation No. 21, and in Unorganized Township No. 2, First Range, sometimes called Indian Township, that portion south of the highway leading from U. S. highway No. 1 to Grand Lake Stream Plantation, as heretofore operated, which in the opinion of the trustees of said district, constituted as hereinafter set forth, may seem necessary or desirable.'
- Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1939, c. 38, § 3, amended. Section 3 of chapter 38 of the private and special laws of 1939 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 3. May enter into contracts. Said district is further authorized and empowered to contract with any person or corporation for a supply of electrical energy to be sold and distributed within the limits of said town

of Princeton, Plantation No. 21, and in Unorganized Township No. 2, First Range, sometimes called Indian Township, that portion south of the highway leading from U. S. Highway No. 1 to Grand Lake Stream Plantation, and to construct a transmission line or lines to connect with the power plant of any such person or corporation, and transmit electrical energy into said town.'
